**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 0600 – 0900

Breakfast will be served in the Dining Hall – Building K.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1030 – 1130

Lunch will be served in the Dining Hall – Building “K”.

HG and P&D must be out of the dining hall by 1130 as this is when the families will be eating lunch and they only have an hour.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1130

Detail Drum contingent to assist HG with walk through.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1230

Pipes tune and band forms up for afternoon practice. Location is South of the “To Lift a Nation” 9-11 Monument – same as last year.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1315

Pipes and Drums work with the Honor Guards and Color Guards to rehearse the Sunday morning memorial service procession.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1330 – 1500

Pipes & Drums return to the practice area for Candlelight Vigil rehearsal

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1500 - 1600

Dining Hall is open to HG and Pipes & Drums – Building K.

Dining Hall must be cleared by 1600 for Families.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1630

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1730

Pipes and Drums form up and take position for the Candlelight Vigil in front of Building “K”.

**SATURDAY**, OCTOBER 3, 2009: 1800

Dining Hall is open for HG and Pipes & Drums. The Band will be served at 1830.

**SUNDAY**, OCTOBER 5, 2008: 0600 – 0900  
Breakfast is served in the Dining Hall – Building K.

**SUNDAY**, OCTOBER 5, 2008: 0900  
Pipes & Drums, and Honor Guard and Color Guard form up to march in review past the stage in front of the gathered survivors and families. The massed bands will pipe the Honor Guard and Color Guard up to the stage to a set of retreat tunes, “*Green Hills of Tyrol, When the Battle’s O’er & Balmoral*”, there to halt for opening ceremonies. Afterwards, all will march off to “*Scotland the Brave / The Rowan Tree*”.

**SUNDAY**, OCTOBER 5, 2008: 1000  
Memorial Service begins.

During the tribute, there will be a presentation of the presidential wreath at the Fallen Firefighters Monument. Three pipers will play “*Going Home*” – these pipers will be chosen by audition on Saturday from those who represent LODD departments.

After the tribute, the Pipes & Drums, Honor Guard and Color Guard will march back to the center of the stage to a drum tap. After benediction, the Pipes, Drums, Honor and Color Guard will march off to the tune “*Wings & Dawning of the Day*”

Following the Sunday morning tribute, the bands will be dismissed and may leave or remain for photographs or visits with survivors, families and friends.
